Making Progress, Fighting for Conservation

We had a lot to be thankful for in 2013. At the top of my list is an incredible team of chapter leaders, volunteers, members, partners, donors and staff that continue to push our organization to new heights. This year we set **FOUR NEW** records: 1. Habitat delivered at 1,463,338 acres; 2. Net revenues of \$65 million; 3. Memberships 141,314; and 4. Youth participants almost 50,000.

Again, our handling of all this conservation activity earned PF a Four Star rating from Charity Navigator (91.6 cents out of every dollar spent on our mission — up from 91.23 in 2012), the highest ranking from the country's largest charity evaluator.

We all know there is much more to do ... just go hunting, pick up a newspaper or watch the news and you'll see. Today, we need your support more than ever — our habitat and hunting heritage are being threatened more than ever.

Be assured, that just like in 2013, Pheasants Forever will continue to grow in its abilities to deliver our mission and have an even greater impact on habitat, our youth and hunting heritage. Thanks for doing your part — banquet attendance was up this year. To me, this shows folks care about pheasants and other wildlife and are stepping up to make a difference in these difficult times.

South Dakota Governor's Pheasant Summit

Another sign folks are willing to fight occurred December 6 when South Dakota Governor Dennis Daugaard gathered over 400 concerned hunters and conservationists, including myself, for a first-of-its-kind Pheasant Summit. It's just what we need in that state and other pheasant states.

It was an inspiring example of an elected official taking a leadership role to save our upland habitat and pheasant hunting tradition. We need Governor Dennis Daugaard's example repeated all over pheasant country. As a major sponsor of the

PF making pheasant habitat in Kansas

Summit, PF is working for just that. We are making a special effort in South Dakota because it is the very best of the country's pheasant hunting; the country and world beat a path to the state every year to pursue the greatest upland bird that's ever taken wing.

Still, as you will see further on in this report, we are making great progress for habitat and youth recruitment in all areas of the country, thanks to PF's model of allowing chapters to keep and control all the funds they raise.

Thanks to all of you who have invested in our Legislative Action Fund (see partial list of donors), which we use to educate Congress and others on the importance of a conservation and landowner-friendly Farm Bill. Your efforts help keep our \$145 billion wildlife recreation industry rolling. Now, we need Congress to pass a Farm Bill. The Farm Bill represents the single largest federal investment in private-lands conservation. It funds programs that improve air and water quality, recharge groundwater aquifers and create fish and wildlife habitat; thereby providing meaningful benefits to all Americans and taxpayers.

Likewise, we strongly support the national Sodsaver provision to reduce incentives for grassland conversion, while still allowing landowners to make their own management decisions. Sodsaver would help preserve our remaining prairies and significant grasslands for both the ranching communities and wildlife that depend on them, and save taxpayers nearly \$200 million over a 10-year period. While the House Farm Bill currently includes a regional sodsaver provision, we believe that only a national policy, such as in the Senate bill, would be effective.

We also strongly support re-linking conservation compliance to crop insurance premium assistance and oppose efforts to weaken conservation compliance in current law. For decades, in exchange for a publicly funded safety net, farmers have adopted land management practices that successfully reduced soil erosion and protected wetlands.

We hope to have such a bill by the time you read this report, including a 24-million acre CRP and with it Continuous CRP, including some new practices such as tall wheat stubble for pheasant nesting cover. Stay tuned to www.pheasantsforever.org for breaking news and updates.

Farm Bill Biologist (FBB) Partnership Program

Our 110 FBBs in 19 states completed nearly a million acres of habitat improvements, the result of over 22,000 landowner contacts. Like we are fond of saying, "there's room for habitat conservation on every farm and ranch" and our FBBs can help to plan, finance, complete and manage those habitat projects.

North Region

Minnesota PF chapters completed 25 land acquisitions, permanently protecting almost 3,600 acres of habitat. Iowa Chapters partnered with the Iowa DNR in completing habitat improvements on 53 public hunting areas in the first year of its Enhance a Wildlife Management Area program. North Dakota's five FBBs assisted landowners in implementing 63,000 acres of wildlife habitat. Wisconsin's 33 chapters completed 713 habitat projects. South Dakota's FBBs worked with over 1,600 farmers/ranchers/landowners on numerous habitat projects.

South Region

Kansas FBBs conducted over 60 landowner workshops and individually contacted 2,320 landowners in Fiscal Year 2013. In the process they were able to impact over 70,000 acres

THE FARM BILL MATTERS

On a recent hunt on CRP ground in western Nebraska with the High Plains Chapter (which will be featured soon in this magazine), our editor and the chapter president bagged both pheasants and sharp-tailed grouse off the project. Conservation partnerships between landowners, chapters and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) work.

To get those Farm Bill programs in the ground, we have 602 PF and 126 Quail Forever chapters in 26 states raising funds and working with landowners. In fact, in 2013 they helped establish over 100,000 acres of nesting habitat, nearly 1,000 acres of winter cover, 2,665 acres of wetlands restored, over 4,000 acres of land acquisitions for permanent hunting habitat and over 73,000 acres of food plots. Our Farm Bill Biologist Partnership field staff was busy as well.

through federal conservation programs and an additional 18,000 acres of technical assistance. Kansas' chapters also had a successful year; they completed over 580 projects that impacted 42,000 acres of habitat!

In Missouri, FBBs hosted 55 landowner workshops that were attended by more than 2,700 people. They contacted over 2,000 landowners to provide one-on-one advice on what they could do to improve their lands. This work resulted in over 30,000 acres of federal programs being implemented and another 1,300 acres of state and PF projects. Show Me State PF/QF chapters conducted 477 habitat projects which impacted 4,500 acres of land including over 830 acres of new nesting cover.

Nebraska's 17 Farm Bill and Coordinating Wildlife Biologists conducted 89 landowner workshops to discuss a wide variety of topics including grassland management, pollinator habitat and federal/state programs that landowners can use to implement habitat projects on their property. This work resulted in over 111,000 acres of habitat being enrolled in Nebraska on over 1,100 projects. Nebraska chapters conducted over 1,400 habitat projects that impacted everything from nesting cover for pheasants and quail to wetland restoration projects for waterfowl. PF would also like to congratulate PF National Board Member Dick Bell on his appointment by Governor Dave Heineman to the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission.

In Texas, FBBs were able to impact well over 97,000 acres of habitat through a mixture of federal programs. They also provided technical assistance to landowners on more than 55,000 acres. This was accomplished through 360 individual landowner contacts.

West Region — Other Upland Species

Pheasants Forever continues to expand conservation delivery for other species, particularly in the west, through its FBB program. In 2013, seven Pheasants Forever biologists delivered over 133,000 acres of habitat enhancement in four states for the greater sage grouse. Two Pheasants Forever biologists enhanced over 33,300 acres of habitat as a part of Idaho's Mule Deer Initiative, which additionally benefits upland species such as sharp-tailed grouse. In New Mexico, one Pheasants Forever biologist delivered nearly 60,000 acres of habitat enhancement for lesser prairie chickens.

A Banner Year for Youth Programs

Through the No Child Left Indoors initiative, Pheasants Forever chapters host a multitude of events to let youth and their families experience the outdoors by learning to shoot, hunt, fish, camp and even plant pollinator habitat. Chapter volunteers share the outdoor traditions they cherish with the next generation of conservationists.

And 2013 was a banner year with more youth events and participants than ever before. Chapters and partners really stepped up to sponsor shooting teams, help with youth habitat projects, host community outdoor days and continue to hold youth mentor hunts around the country. Their grassroots efforts made it possible for almost 50,000 youth to have fun in the outdoors.



The brand new youth habitat education program in 2013 created 13 projects that had 819 youth, with the help of 111 adults, planting 26 acres of pollinator habitat in their communities. These projects will help both the birds and the bees!

YOUTH PROGRAMS MAKE A DIFFERENCE: DULUTH, MINNESOTA

Youth events not only make a difference for many of the young people who participate, they make a difference for chapters that put them on. One example is the St. Louis/Carlton County Chapter in the urban locale of Duluth, Minnesota. The chapter was struggling to stay alive with less than a handful of volunteers, low banquet attendance and decreasing financial resources. That all changed this past year when Youth Chair David Lood took a big leap and decided to raise the money to purchase a piece of land near a grade school in the community. The chapter raised the money and bought the land, drew together community partners for a dedication, received lots of local publicity and will make an outdoor classroom out of it.

Currently, the land is overgrown and virtually unusable by wildlife. But, the school and its partners will re-establish natural and functional habitat for native flora and fauna with the addition of a new wetland.

Of the project, one teacher wrote, "The third graders LOVED being on the property last Friday! David, thank you and Pheasants Forever for such a wonderful gift and for spending so much time with our students. We are kind of planning to go each week...the children loved the part where you showed them how a tree had grown around netting left in the woods, it really opened their eyes to being good stewards of the land."

In 2013, the chapter went from three volunteers on their committee to 10, from four youth participants per year to 336, from 90 banquet attendees to 196 and from \$12,000 in their treasury to over \$28,000. A University professor is using the project as a model for his students, and the YMCA and PTA brought in adult volunteers to help clean up the property. Another school is also interested in working with the chapter on a school forest. Youth programs can make a difference for an entire community.


